ave you ever played the game "Whack-A-Mole"?
If so, then you understand how difficult it is to track bills during the waning days of a legislative session.

"This year has been particularly difficult to follow bills," said Rich Gannon, director of governmental affairs for the Kansas Press Association. "The joint rules have been exploited fully this year, and even legislators have had trouble keeping track of their own issues. The services like KanFocus and even the official legislative website have had difficulties as well."

If you were following Senate Bill 70, which would have brought clarity to the Kansas Open Meetings Act's executive sessions requirements, you would instead find House Sub for SB 70, a bill placing restrictions on amusement park rides
